

Feedback Week - Student Guide

What is different about this final week of term?

During this last week of term we like you all to spend some time responding to feedback from teachers. After this you will have a choice to do a project where you choose the area to learn about or to go back and finish off work you haven't had a chance to complete.

What will I need to do?

This week your google classroom will look slightly different and will contain fewer documents. You should look to complete them in this order.

1) Read and respond to feedback:

Class teachers will be giving you whole class feedback - you should look to read this and then complete any response tasks.

2) Self Reflection on key work:

Class teachers will be setting a checklist which will remind you of the most important tasks. Please rate your confidence in the work set:

Red = I have not started this work and I will look at it again this week

Amber = I could complete the work but I am not sure if it is secure in my memory

Green = I could do the work really well and I have remembered most of what I learnt

It is really important to be honest as this will help to let teachers know how you have found the work they've set so far.

3) Enrichment work or catch up on missed work

We have put together a set of enrichment materials which will allow you to explore topics your choosing. Once feedback and reflection is complete you can spend time pursuing topics which interest you most.

The enrichment work will require you to be more independent so you may prefer to return to any previous work which you had run out of time to do or want to improve.

The self reflection checklist we hope will guide you to the best things to work on.

'**Red**' these should be the first work to revisit and complete during the week. Next do work you've said was '**amber**', particularly if the teacher has given guidance on how to improve it.

If you are stuck contact your teachers for help via email.

Why is it different this week?

We know that you have been working very hard during the school closure and your teachers wanted to give you feedback on this. We're also aware that we have set you a lot of work and we wanted a chance to catch up on missed work.

What should I do if I have completed all my work?

Many of you have worked really hard to keep completely up to date and so will not have any missed work. You should focus on the enrichment project and spend as long as you are able enjoying exploring some of the amazing and fascinating resources that are out there. We have organised some of the best ones into one for you to explore - just look at the links section at the end of the enrichment project document.

How should I organise my time?

Teachers will look to upload their feedback as soon as the week begins so the first step would be to work through your normal timetable completing the feedback tasks and checklists. If a subject is not in your classroom when you look, move onto another one and check back later.

Routine is very important and this will be more difficult if you are doing a more independent piece of work like an enrichment project. It is worth dividing your day into manageable chunks and the model of the school day is a good starting point for this.
